garden facts

The pink flowering dogwood was discovered by Bruce Howell in Prosser's Woods, behind Chilhowee Park around the turn of the 20th century.

The Howell Nursery received the first plant patent on a Grape Myrtle, *Lagerstromia indica* 'William Tooney' in 1927. This cultivar is still widely used today.

The Howell Nursery was the oldest continually operated business in Tennessee until 2003 when it was closed, logging over 217 years of selling plants.
