garden facts

The Howell Nursery received the first plant patent on a Crape Myrtle, Lagerstromeia indica 'William Tooney' in 1927. This cultivar is still widely used today.

The Howell Nursery was the oldest continually operated business in Tennessee until 2003 when it was closed, logging over 217 years of selling plants.
